Area Foster Care update

Last week we learned that there are 30 children in foster care in Stark, Golden Valley, Billings and Dunn counties, with half of those in the Dickinson area. While there are 23 licensed foster homes and 17 open beds, Natalie Straub, right, state foster care licensing specialist, said that the number of foster homes has been declin-



ing since 2020. She said that the good news is that fewer children are being removed from their homes due to child protection workers helping families at home. Foster parent Laura Walters started a new nonprofit, Foster for'em, to support foster families, children and the biological families. She also started a Foster Closet with toys and supplies that foster families may need.


