Last week: Clean water, well saving kids

ids and families in a small village in eastern Kenya, on the continent of Africa, now have safe clean drinking water, thanks to a multi-international Rotary district project. Last week, Fred Rau from the Forest Lake, MN



Rotary Club told us via Zoom about the solar well and storage system and distribution kiosk. The village water committee and a local Rotary Club identified this need for the village to move from boiling muddy, dirty water that was collected far away along a dangerous route to clean, safe water in the village. The water is tested and now children are not exposed to water-borne diseases. The project cost was \$90,000 US, or 11 million Kenya shillings. The clubs raised \$25,000, received additional contributions of \$36,000 and used a \$30,000 grant from The Rotary Foundation. The local committee is trained to repair and sustain the well. About 15 Kenyan shillings pays for four to five gallons of water from the kiosk and the money goes into a fund for well repairs.
