east and Africa. The state missions this past year have included wildfire support, particularly near Mandaree, and breaking up dangerous ice jams. Johnson spoke about the Guard's unmanned aircraft, training and deployments in operational support of the Army and Air Force. The North Dakota National Guard operates out of 14 locations.
