Rotary also provides vitamins, worm medicine, mosquito nets and other health needs when out vaccinating children. The couple has traveled the world immunizing and volunteering at surveillance clinics. At present, there's about 13 polio cases in two countries. Rotary has raised \$2 billion that has been matched 2 to 1 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. They emphasized that everyone in the world needs to be vaccinated until polio is eradicated.
